

FACT SHEET

KEEPING OF POULTRY AND PIGEONS

This information sheet is designed to summarise the Keeping of Poultry and Pigeons as required by the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder Health Local Laws.

Definition: Poultry includes bantams, ducks and other domestic fowls. Definition does not include roosters.

A person may keep a combined maximum of 12 poultry and pigeons.

An affiliated person may keep up to 150 pigeons and 12 poultry.

"Affiliated Person" means a person who is a member of:

- a) The Pigeon Racing Federation of WA
- b) The Fancy Utility Pigeon Club of WA
- c) The Southern Districts Pigeon and Bantam Club; or
- d) Any other properly constituted Pigeon Club.

Conditions of keeping poultry, pigeons or doves:

Poultry, pigeons or doves may only be kept under the following conditions:

- a) No poultry, pigeon or dove is able to approach within 9m of a house, public building or food premises.
- b) All poultry are kept in a properly constructed and securely fastened structure or enclosure.
- c) No poultry are able to approach within 9m of a street, excluding right of ways unless Council approves otherwise.
- d) No poultry is able to approach within 1.2 metres of any side or rear boundary of the premises.
- e) Except where registered homing pigeons are freed for exercise, the pigeons or doves are kept on a properly constructed pigeon loft or dove cote that
 - i) does not exceed 3.6m in height from the ground; and
 - ii) is in a yard having an otherwise unobstructed area of at least 30 square metres.

Roosters, Geese, Turkeys, Peafowl and Gamebirds:

Roosters, Geese, Turkeys, Peafowl and Gamebirds are not to be kept on any premises without the written approval of the Environmental Health and Rangers Team Leader.
