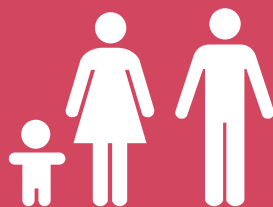

Creativity and Culture

Kalgoorlie-Boulder's thriving arts and culture scene is reflected through our schools. There are many opportunities for local students to showcase their talents through performances at community events and school concerts, taking part in workshops and exhibitions at the Goldfields Arts Centre, and more.

There is a collaborative approach between all local primary and secondary schools, comprehensive support for school readiness, and programs for successful pathways to higher education, training and employment.

Supporting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students to Shine

Integrated Support

A variety of programs support the development of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students in Kalgoorlie-Boulder. They include the Kindilink program at Boulder Primary School, which is based in the school's ECE area; the teaching of the Wangkatja language at South Kalgoorlie Primary School; and the study of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures being a cross curriculum priority at North Kalgoorlie Primary School, where the training of Wongutha language teachers is supported.

East Kalgoorlie Primary School

East Kalgoorlie Primary School has been recognised at a local, state and national level for its outstanding contribution to Aboriginal education in Kalgoorlie-Boulder. The school has developed various culturally responsive educational programs, and in 2023 became a Quality Teaching School Lead, supporting schools across the state with strong educational programs and intervention processes.

Follow the Dream Program

The Follow the Dream program offers comprehensive support to Aboriginal students from John Paul College, Eastern Goldfields College and Kalgoorlie-Boulder Community High School. It provides personalised learning and specialist tutoring, one-on-one mentoring, career camps, university tours, workplace visits, internships, work experience, awards and scholarships, cultural experiences, wellbeing support and life-long membership of the Alumni Network. The program is backed by the Polly Farmer Foundation at all three schools, and additionally by AngloGold Ashanti sponsorship at John Paul College.

Stars Program

The Stars Program aims to enhance the life skills and self-esteem of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young women who are selected for the program. Working with students at Eastern Goldfields College and Kalgoorlie-Boulder Community High School, the program is overseen by the Stars Foundation. It provides comprehensive support to nurture program participants, helping them attend school, stay engaged, complete Year 12, and confidently transition into the workforce or further education.

Clontarf Academies

Goldfields Clontarf Academy was established in 2002 and now operates as Kalgoorlie-Boulder Clontarf Academy at Kalgoorlie-Boulder Community High School, catering for male Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in Years 7 to 10; and the Eastern Goldfields Clontarf Academy at Eastern Goldfields College, for students in Years 11 and 12. Academy students engage in activities throughout their schooling that foster life skills, self-esteem, discipline and academic growth, while also nurturing leadership qualities and employment prospects. The Academies prepare students for the workforce through exposure to local employers via site visits and employment forums.

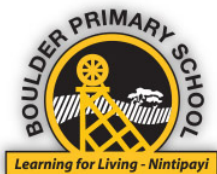

East Kalgoorlie Primary School (EKPS) is located on the eastern fringe of the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder. EKPS remains a local intake school that educates students from the entire city with an average enrolment of 160 students, 94% of whom are Aboriginal.

EKPS prides itself on having vigorous wrap-around services that emphasise student health and wellbeing, high-quality teaching and learning, and strong relationships within the school and community. All staff members are highly active and visible around the school and develop strong relationships with students and their families. We have developed various educational programs that support students' academic and developmental progress. Our PRIDE values, positive, respectful, inclusive, determined and excellent, are evident throughout the school and are consistently celebrated.



Three things to love about East Kalgoorlie Primary School

- 1 We strive to embed culturally responsive programs, including Two-Way Science. This incorporates the local area, Aboriginal perspectives and the Western Australian science curriculum. This is supported by all students learning the Wangkatja language.
- 2 Our whole school approach of targeted teaching in the form of Explicit Instruction (EI) and Explicit Direction Instruction (EDI) aligns with research as a highly effective method of improving and sustaining student achievement levels while bridging the gap for Indigenous students.
- 3 During 2023, EKPS became a Quality Teaching School Lead, supporting schools across the state with our strong educational programs and intervention processes.

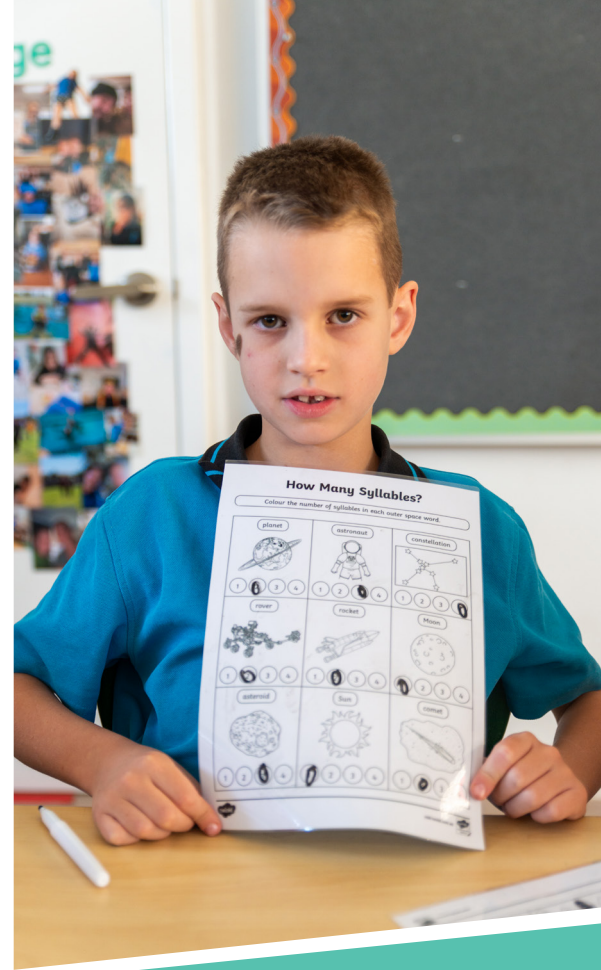

O'Connor Education Support Centre is located in the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder and provides education opportunities for children with special needs from kindergarten to year 6. We create a caring and supportive environment that supports the academic, physical, emotional and social development of children with disabilities in Kalgoorlie-Boulder, Kambalda and Coolgardie.

At O'Connor Education Support Centre, we support our students to grow and develop the skills they need to function independently in the community. Our special needs trained teachers and education assistants create individual programs designed to suit each child, with input from parents and therapists. Each classroom has a teacher and several education assistants so that each child can receive the attention and support they need.

We have many links with the wider community and the disability sector in Kalgoorlie, and our school council also has community and disability sector representatives. O'Connor Education Support Centre shares a site with O'Connor Primary School, and both schools have a commitment to inclusion, which enhances opportunities to engage in mainstream activities.

Our students have access to lockers, and the teaching team has been expanded to introduce multiple class locations and teachers, led by our year 6 lead/homeroom teacher.

Our senior students also have the opportunity to grow and develop their leadership capabilities by participating in student-led ministry groups. Our aim is to develop students with kind and caring dispositions, strong morals, and a growth mindset.

Our middle school campus is co-located with Kalgoorlie Boulder Community High School where we employ a student-centred approach to drive the development, implementation, and regular review of Individual Education Plans. Highly skilled and passionate educators work together to support students to develop knowledge and understanding in key areas of literacy, numeracy, technologies, social skills, self-management and wellbeing.

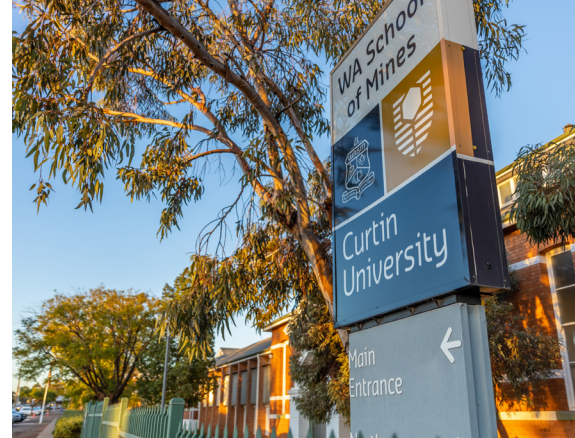
Have fun in the park

- Apprenticeship Support Australia offers support and advice for employers, apprentices, trainees and jobseekers.
- The Kalgoorlie Jobs and Skills Centre provides free and independent information about training, pathways, career guidance and planning, and current employment opportunities. The team is experienced in Aboriginal workforce development and supporting Aboriginal jobseekers.
- World class opportunities for rural and remote medical education and allied health experiences are offered on-site at Curtin's Kalgoorlie Campus through the Rural Health Multidisciplinary Training program and the University Department of Rural Health, based at the Rural Health Campus.
- Students studying online at Curtin via Open Universities have access to Curtin's Kalgoorlie-Boulder facilities and specialist support services.
