5 ELECTION OF DEPUTY MAYOR

In accordance with schedule 2.3 of the Local Government Act 1995 (WA), the election of office of the Deputy Mayor is to be filled as the next matter dealt with after the Mayor is elected at the first meeting of the Council after an ordinary election day.

The following extract from the Local Government Act 1995 (WA) details the procedure that will be followed:

8. How deputy mayor is elected

- 1. The council is to elect a councillor (other than the mayor) to fill the office.
- 2. The election is to be conducted in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the mayor, or if he or she is not present, by the CEO.
- 3. Nominations for the office are to be given to the person conducting the election in writing before the meeting or during the meeting before the close of nominations.
 - (3a) Nominations close at the meeting at a time announced by the person conducting the election, which is to be a sufficient time after the announcement by that person that nominations are about to close to allow for any nominations made to be dealt with.
- 4. If a councillor is nominated by another councillor the person conducting the election is not to accept the nomination unless the nominee has advised the person conducting the election, orally or in writing, that he or she is willing to be nominated for the office.
- 5. The council members are to vote on the matter by secret ballot as if they were electors voting at an election.
- 6. Subject to clause 9(1) the votes cast under subclause (5) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, in accordance with Schedule 4.1 as if those votes were votes cast at an election.
- 7. As soon as is practicable after the result of the election is known, the person conducting the election is to declare and give notice of the result in accordance with regulations, if any.

9. Votes may be cast a second time

- 1. If, when the votes cast under clause 8(5) are counted, there is an equality of votes between 2 or more candidates who are the only candidates in, or remaining in, the count, the count is to be discontinued and, not more than 7 days later, a special meeting of the council is to be held.
- 2. Any nomination for the office may be withdrawn, and further nominations may be made, before or when the special meeting is held.
- 3. When the special meeting is held the council members are to vote again on the matter by secret ballot as if they were voting at an election.
- 4. The votes cast under subclause (3) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, under Schedule 4.1 as if those votes were votes cast at an election

In accordance with section 2.29 of the Local Government Act 1995 (WA), a person elected as a Deputy Mayor is to make a declaration in the prescribed form before acting in the office. The declaration will be provided at the meeting.

5.1 Call for Nominations

The Mayor will call for nominations for Deputy Mayor along with any nominations already received.

5.2 Statement by each Nominee

Each nominee will provided with an opportunity to present their case for election.

5.3 Election by Secret Ballot

The Chief Executive Officer will be the Returning Officer for the election of Deputy Mayor and will conduct the ballot by secret vote. The Chief Executive Officer will declare the result of the election of the Deputy Mayor.

5.4 Response by Deputy Mayor

The Deputy Mayor will be invited to make a verbal presentation to Council.
