#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The 2019/20 draft budget has been prepared in accordance with the budget parameters set by Council and incorporates all matters and requests considered by Council to date. It also contains sufficient funding to deliver the works and services capital works and provisions needed to deliver for the community and is in line with our four (4) year business and long term financial plans. The budget assumes a starting point of a surplus in 2018/19 of \$2.15million and delivers a surplus of \$2.2million in 2019/20. Council requested that the budget be framed with a surplus equal to 3% of income rather than the 2% set in previous years; however, this has not been possible due to both the constraints with the budget requests and the requirements under the *Local Government Act 1995*, mandating the general rates collection does not exceed 110% of the budget deficiency. The surplus as presented equals 2.3% of the total income and 109% of the budget deficiency equation.

A full breakdown of all budget lines is circulated under separate cover for your reference.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The purpose of this report is to update the drainage capital works program for 5-years to 2024. In doing so, an update is provided on a works schedule previously endorsed by Council. Changes are proposed to works priorities, scheduling and budget allocations.

A substantially enlarged program of works is proposed to address flooding at Charles Street. This includes an allocation of \$3.08M to undertake works upstream, works at Charles Street itself and works downstream to take water away from private property. A community information session is recommended to explain the proposed works, along with ongoing engagement as works proceed.

Subject to adoption, the financial allocations are included in the 19/20 budget and subsequent forecasts through to year 2024.

#### **REPORT**

#### **Background**

Stormwater runoff characteristics in Kalgoorlie-Boulder are well understood. The combination of high-intensity rainfall events and impervious (clay) soils leads to high volume stormwater flows through drainage catchments. Water movement is managed through a combination of open drainage swales (predominantly within the road pavements) and some underground piping. The overall objective is to prevent flooding of private property, and allow movement of water through natural drainage channels. Ongoing capital works are required to reduce flood risk and better manage peak stormwater flows.

In October, 2018, Council adopted a program of capital works for the current financial year. The financial allocation for the works totalled \$1.48M across 17 projects (including budgeted projects and an allocation of budget surplus funds). At the same time, Council also adopted as a guide, a schedule of works for future years up to year 22/23. The future program was noted as subject to annual review having regard for newly identified works along with review of priorities, cost estimates and budget allocations.

This report reviews the two project schedules, recommending a revised program to address issues arising.

#### **Details**

The two works programs considered by Council last year are now addressed.

## Drainage Construction Program – 2018/19

Along with the addition of work at Charles Street (funded through allocation of budget surplus), the priorities in the following table were adopted by Council for the current financial year.

The above works that require program revision are described:

• Boulder Road – Stage 1: programming has been delayed through procurement processes, and is rescheduled for late 2019 calendar year.

- 114 Ward Street: works require an easement on private property. Easement processes cannot be completed until late 2019. The project is relisted for completion in 2019/20.
- O'Connor Street Borromei Gouge Streets: this work is proposed to be included within the scope of the Boulder Road works stage 2.
- 11 Boulder Road: works require an easement on private property. Easement processes cannot be completed until late 2019. The project is relisted for completion in 2019/20.
- 213-225 Boulder Road: This work is downstream of land under control of KCGM. KCGM has indicated intention to construct a detention dam which reduces the need and associated priority of the planned work.
- Charles Street: refer to discussion below.

#### Charles Street Drainage

Various measures have been put in place over the years to help redirect and disperse stormwater arriving at Charles Street. This includes changes to road levels to re-direct water, installation of side entry pits and underground pipework, and overland flow paths.

As changes have occurred in the area, the amount of water runoff and directions of that runoff change. Dependent on the nature of rainfall events, these various factors combine to cause flooding of private property – including property/extent of flooding not previously experienced.

Factors contributing to flooding at Charles Street are complex, and further investigation and detailed design has found that works, in isolation, will not solve flooding issues.

#### Solutions

The solution to drainage issues at Charles Street requires three areas to be addressed:

- 1. <u>Upstream</u>: knowing where the water is coming from and 'holding-back' or diverting where possible;
- 2. <u>Charles Street</u>: increasing the capacity of Charles Street itself to hold water and effectively remove this water; and
- 3. <u>Downstream</u>: enable water to continue to flow away from Charles Street in the direction of Gribble Creek.

Dealing with one of the three issue alone will not solve the problem. For example, new works at Charles Street will not alleviate flooding without the ability to move the water downstream through the race course.

Considerable engineering design work has been undertaken for works at Charles Street as budgeted for within the current financial year. As the design has progressed, it has become apparent that this work, in isolation, will cause flooding

from the rear of Charles Street properties – creating a different problem. For this reason, the work has been held until a comprehensive solution can be achieved as now outlined.

#### Upstream Strategy

Hydrological modelling has been undertaken to define the catchment contributing to flooding at Charles Street. This catchment extends north-east to Brown Avenue (adjacent Goldfields Highway) and covers an area of 127 hectares.

Works within this catchment that will ease Charles Street include:

- Modifying the levels at the Egan/Lionel streets roundabout to divert water away from Charles Street towards Meldrum Avenue; and
- Install pipe drainage at Boulder Road to divert water to the south-east away from the Charles Street catchment.

#### Charles Street Strategy

This approach involves removing water from the road pavement by catching (sideentry pits) and diverting water away. It also involves increasing the water holding capacity of the roadway itself to lessen overflow risk to private property. Works to achieve this include:

- Lowering the road surface;
- Increasing crossover heights;
- Increasing kerb heights;
- Increasing the capacity of pits and pipes;
- Increasing culvert capacity;
- Increasing channel capacity with the parkland; and
- Removing clogging obstruction at the park.

#### Downstream Strategy

Engineering services have engaged with the racecourse owners to reach agreement on a range of works that will allow water to move away from Charles Street. This works include:

- Constructing a detention basin immediately south of Charles Street and north of the racecourse;
- Installing pipework to an existing circular basin at the racecourse infield; and
- Undertaking works that will facilitate overland flow of water.

The works described above are planned to be undertaken within the following allocations and timeframes:

In addition to the works identified within the above program, further measures can be explored in the future including holding water (delaying movement) within the wider road pavements in the catchment, and detaining water within parklands. These measures would help to reduce downstream peak flows and lower flood levels.

A revised stormwater drainage construction program for 5-years ending 23/24 is recommended reflecting the changes outlined above.

#### Community Engagement – Charles Street

Various landowners at Charles Street have been in contact with the City to address issues and find out what can be done. Some owners have cited particular changes in the upstream catchment that have intensified flooding, and have provided officers with a good understanding of circumstances.

To help keep residents informed of plans that have now been prepared in response to the issues, a public information session is proposed. This will allow works in the catchment as a whole to be explained, questions answered and timing/scheduling outlined.

Communications would involve a circular to residents at Charles Street inviting attendance at a public information session. Upon commencement of actual construction affecting Charles Street, further resident communication will be conducted regularly as required.

#### Burton Place

Property at 4 Burton Place has been subject to repeat flooding. On three occasions (10 February 2017, 2 March 2018 and 10 December 2018), stormwater entered the dwelling requiring replacement of carpets, hard floors, kitchen and built in robes along with personal belongings. The home has been uninhabitable for a period following these events.

Burton Place runs parallel to Hawkins Street. Stormwater coming down Varden Street hits Hawkins Street and continues through private property to 4 Burton Place. Development on properties in the vicinity has helped funnel water toward this property, resulting in repeated flood events.

The possible acquisition of this property by the City will be subject to a separate report to Council.

#### Drainage Construction Program – 2018/19 to 2023/24

An updated 5-year works program is proposed to guide ongoing budget allocations according to works priorities. The table below shows the previously endorsed program, identifies proposed changes (marked amendments) and incorporates new/rescheduled initiatives. Key changes to note are:

- Works continuing from 18/19 program are re-listed;
- Boulder Road works are reduced from 4 stages to 3;
- Projects are postponed where higher priority works are identified; and
- Four Gribble Creek projects with a combined value of \$940,000, originally programmed for 20/21 and 21/22 have been delayed. The suggested change

of priorities is based on solving immediate drainage issues while recognising that Gribble Creek will continue to need further improvements on a longer term basis. Many of the proposed new drainage projects will have a positive impact on peak flows through Gribble Creek by slowing down and holding storm water and attenuating flows. Delayed works will be included in future programs.
